Notes:

• For the Junior Championship, you must enter at least one of the relays on Saturday as your Qualification shoot plus the "Junior Championship". To enter as a Junior, you must be under 21 on Saturday 12th March.

• For the Aggregate, enter 2 relays on Saturday. Competition A will be the first relay shot and Competition B will be the second relay entered.

STS Membership is not restricted to shooters living in Scotland.

Covid-19 Restrictions

Details of Covid-19 restriction will be emailed to all entrants prior to the Championship. The restrictions will reflect the legal requirements and guidance which in place in Scotland at the time of the event.

Matches

• The Scottish Men's Air Pistol and Rifle Championships

The Men's Championship is open to Men and Junior Men in Open and Confined categories and comprises a qualification stage and a final. The leading 8 competitors will qualify for the Championship ISSF 24 shot final, to be shot on the Sunday.

• The Scottish Women's Air Pistol and Rifle Championships

The Women's Championship is open to Women and Junior Women in Open and Confined categories and comprises a qualification stage and a final. The leading 8 competitors will qualify for the Championship ISSF 24 shot final, to be shot on the Sunday.

• The Scottish Junior Men's Air Pistol and Rifle Championships

Under 21 years of age on the first day of the event, in Open and Confined categories, and comprises a qualification stage and a final. The Competition A score will be used for the qualification score. The leading 8 competitors will qualify for the Championship ISSF 24 shot final, to be shot on the Saturday.

• The Scottish Junior Women's Air Pistol and Rifle Championships

Under 21 years of age on the first day of the event, in Open and Confined categories, and comprises a qualification stage and a final. The Competition A score will be used for the qualification score. The leading 8 competitors will qualify for the Championship ISSF 24 shot final, to be shot on the Saturday.

• Men and Women Classified 60 shot matches Air Pistol and Rifle – Competition A, Competition B & Aggregate

To be run to NSRA rules to allow the inclusion of disabled shooters with the exception that the rifle scores will be in decimal. Disabled shooters will be allowed to compete in these competitions but cannot proceed to any of the ISSF finals. To be shot on Saturday.

Event Rules

The Junior and Open Championships will be run according to the ISSF rules that were in force in 2021. This applies to qualification and finals.

Competition A, Competition B and the Aggregate will be run according to NSRA rules.



Classification

Competition A, Competition B and the Aggregate are in classes and require you to provide your average score when entering. The Junior Championship on Saturday and the Open Championship on Sunday are shot in a single class. The championship events will also include a Scottish confined competition - open to those who are eligible to shoot for Scotland. If you qualify, please choose the "confined entry" option when entering to indicate eligibility.

Equipment Control

If participating in any of the Championship events then pistols, rifles and other equipment must comply with ISSF equipment rules. Safety flags for air pistols and rifles MUST be used and MUST extend through the full length of the barrel.

Shooters with a Disability

Venue Accessibility

The Napier University Centre for Sport and Recreation is an accessible venue.

Eligibility to Enter

Since this event is run following ISSF rules, it is not generally open to competitors with a disability unless the competitor is able to comply with the ISSF rules.

However, disabled shooters may compete in the Men and Women Classified 60 shot matches Air Pistol and Rifle on Saturday 12 March but cannot proceed to any of the ISSF finals. To be shot on Saturday.

Doping Control

Scottish Target Shooting follows the doping regulations adopted by British Shooting, developed with UKAD. As such, the testing for banned substances may be carried out at any time. Please declare any medication at check-in before shooting.

Closing Dates and Wait List

The closing date for entries is Sunday 6 March 2022. If an event is full, please select the waiting list and provide us with your availability and you will be placed on a wait list and contacted only if a place becomes available.

Refunds

Cancellations made after the closing date of the event will not be entitled to a refund except in exceptional circumstances and at the discretion of the STS Office.



Air Weapon Permit

Following a change in the law on 31 December 2016, it is now necessary to have an air weapon certificate to possess, use or purchase an air weapon in Scotland.

If you hold a valid firearm and/or shotgun certificate that was issued in Scotland, England or Wales before 31 December 2016, you do not need a separate air weapon certificate until your existing certificate expires. A Northern Irish firearm certificate is not valid in Scotland.

Please Note: You cannot hold a certificate under the age of 14. If you're over 14 but under 18 you can apply for a certificate but you can't buy, hire or own an air weapon.

Visiting Scotland with an Air Weapon

Anyone visiting Scotland intending to use an air weapon but not holding a valid certificate will need to apply for and obtain a visitor's permit or a full air weapon certificate. Visitor Permits are issued by Police Scotland.

Visitors to Scotland bringing their own air rifle and/or air pistol are responsible for ensuring they have the necessary permit and/or certificate in order to compete at STS events held in Scotland.
